

The Baker Clause (statutory legislation) stipulates that schools provide opportunities for a range of education and training providers to have access to pupils in years 8-13 to talk to them about technical qualifications and apprenticeships. At Mayfield we introduce our Careers Programme in year 7, which encompasses the above alongside a diverse range of opportunities for students, and in doing so meets the requirements of the eight Gatsby Benchmarks.







Pupils in year 9 begin a transition process, where they and their families are invited to meet with the Trust's Careers Advisors to explore education pathways available after year 11. Pupils have a 1:1 meeting with their CA and receive a Career Action **Plan**. In Key Stage 4, families submit a Post-16 preference form to SENAR naming at least one setting and apply directly to the setting(s). A decision is then shared with families by 31st March of academic year 11.



If your child is a post-16 transfer, or chooses to continue their education at Mayfield's Sixth Form, they will undergo a similar **transition** from year 13 onwards. Alongside the **Birmingham Local Offer**, post-19 options also include Health and Social care-funded pathways.
